With great sadness, I have the following news: From a Chapter 31 member came the news that Albert Odmark passed away in Seattle on January 21st 2010. Many of our chapter members will remember him and his love for clocks and watches. Albert traveled world wide adding to his collection many fine clocks and watches.

On April 3rd 1959 the NAWCC Headquarters received a petition requesting the formation of Pacific Northwest Chapter 31. In this document Albert was one of eighteen signatures to make the request, and becoming one of our chapters' founding fathers. On May 8, 1959, a Charter was granted, and on February 20, 1960 the first official meeting was held at the home of Harley Prior in Hillsboro, Oregon. Earl Hackett was elected President, Albert Odmark Vice President, and Millie Prior Secretary-Treasurer.
