HELP WANTED



I have an English tall case clock about 1812-1835, that was my grandfathers. He died 50 years ago. It is in a nice mahogany case. The lower door is badly twisted and I have no idea how to correct it. The dial is hand painted with mirror image cottage spandrels. I have serviced the movement and it runs fine, 8 day time and strike. The strike is a little moody and the moon dial does not turn. In fact I see no mechanism to advance the moon dial. The

moon wheel appears to have 120 teeth. The calendar wheel is driven from a pin on the striking snail but advances the calendar hand backwards. There is no indication of the maker on the movement but the dial was made by Walker & Hughes hence the 1812-1835.



My grandfather died when I was seven. Two years later I asked my mother what happened to his three Grandfather clocks. She told me they had been given to the grand children. I then asked her "where is mine". She said it went to Auntie Florrie. Next time we visited Auntie Florrie, I blurted out

"you have my clock". Many years later when I got Married, Auntie Florrie announced I could have my clock.
