The Jackson Tower Clock



After the wonderful meeting at OMSI there was question brought up regarding the tower clock on display. For those who don't know, it was totally restored by our own Godfather's of chapter 31. I began searching for more verification regarding which clock this really was. Where was the Journal clock that OMSI claims ownership of, if the clock that we restored is really the Oregonian clock as our previous research had shown?

That brought me to the Jackson Tower in downtown Portland, Oregon. I found a page on Wikipedia that stated that the Jackson Tower, built in 1912 was named for the original owner of the building and owner of the Oregon Journal Newspaper.

The article stated that it had a clock in the tower that was no longer working. In short order an appointment was made to look at the tower clock. I called George Matto and Marietta

and met the building manager for a tour.

Up 12 floors, then through a tenant's office and up another 2 narrow low head-room flights of stairs we came to see the clock. It is an electric with four arms going out to the 12 ft. tall dials that can be seen below in the Pioneer Square. We were told that when the original elevators below the clock were being replaced that a worker stepped on one of the arms to the dial breaking it. Besides that, the movement is horribly grimy and was told that the hands of the clock bound up and the motor doesn't work anymore.

The building manager told us that the owners would like to get the clock working and the possibility of city historical funds or other monies that would help in the restoration if the chapter would offer to clean-up and get the clock in working order.

Though this isn't the end of my search, it does offer our chapter another chance to restore a historical clock as a community service and it is my hope that several of our member's would be up to this not-so-big challenge.

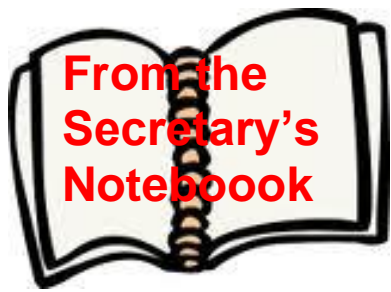
