# October 2009 Work Shop

This is Mike's third workshop on the use of the jewelers lathe, topic this time "how to hold work" on your lathe. The past two workshops had larger attendance, but the nine that came to this one really learned some unique ways to hold work in the lathe. You can have the knowledge of dismantling and cleaning or making cutters and gravers for you lathe, but if you don't know how to hold the work, you are at a loss.

Mike illustrated the use of 3 & 4 jaw chucks, bezel chucks, and the standard WW collets. But sometimes you need to make tooling to hold your work, and Mike showed many ways that he has learned over the years of lathe use.



Many were in question how to set-up the cutting tool and cross slide to make certain the cutting edge is absolute centered on the stock you are turning. While utterly simple, you don't realize this until shown this nifty trick; this impressed all attending!
